What is Family ASL?

Family ASL is a sign language class that is geared towards teaching parents and family members how to communicate with their deaf and hard of hearing child.

Participants learn basic signs relating to the family and home environment, phrases, grammar, and mini lessons in Deaf culture.

The classes are held once a week for one to two hours. The class size is generally small, averaging 8-10 participants.

Participants learn in a comfortable and friendly environment through handouts, powerpoints, games and instruction by a qualified deaf teacher.

Can I bring my children?

Yes! Childcare is provided at no additional cost for children ages 2-10. Your children will be supervised and enjoy crafts, games, activities and light refreshments.

Children over 10 must sit in the class with the adult they came with - whether or not they participate.

How much does it cost?

DOE families: \$50/10 weeks (Financial Aid is available.)

Non-DOE and Professionals: \$100/10 weeks
